Today, Virginia City stands as a link to the past- a town vibrant with the activities of visitors, and filled with memories and ghosts of days gone by.

Our personal guide will escort us through the downtown, telling many legends of "rags to riches" and "riches to rags".



There are beautiful Victorian mansions, mines, wooden sidewalks, original saloons, gambling halls, antique shops, museums and churches to visit. You can tour the town on foot or board the trolley to see the sites.
